

Lloyd's Flyfishing Society

Membership Rules



1. Membership is on an annual basis renewable by the Society upon receipt of the full annual subscription and conditional upon the Member undertaking to abide by the Society's Membership Rules.
2. New Members will, at the time of joining the Society, pay a joining fee in addition to the first year's subscription.
3. Members shall at all times conduct themselves in a manner that will neither cause embarrassment to Lloyd's or the Society nor bring either of them into disrepute.
4. Members shall, at all times, behave courteously towards fellow Members, officials and their staff involved in any of the Society's activities and all members of the general public.
5. The Society respects the rights, dignity and worth of every person and will treat everybody equally, regardless of age, ability, gender, race, ethnicity, religious belief, sexuality or social/economic status. Members undertake to support the Society's position in this regard and behave accordingly.
6. Members, taking advantage of any fishing activity offered by or through the Society, undertake to familiarise themselves with the Society's Fishing Rules and to be bound by those Rules.
7. Members attending any function or activity offered by or arranged for the Society do so at their own risk and the Society accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage to any Member's property or injury to any Member arising from such attendance.
8. Members shall be responsible for, and hold the Society harmless from, any loss or damage caused to third party property and/or any death or injury sustained by a third party arising from any act or omission of the Member. However, the Society shall procure Third Party Liability insurance in respect of its fishing activities, with a Limit of Indemnity of not less than £5,000,000, for the benefit of all Members.
9. The Society shall retain only the personal information of Members that is necessary to enable it to effectively operate as a fishing society and shall not pass said information to any third party without the permission of the Member(s). Any Member who becomes privy to the personal information of any other Member(s) shall treat that information in confidence and not disclose it to any third party.
10. Members who invite a guest(s) to any function or activity offered by or arranged for the Society shall accompany the guest(s) and be responsible for the behaviour of the guest(s) having beforehand made the guest(s) familiar with the Society's Rules and obtained an undertaking from the guest(s) to abide by them.
